05/88

CORNISH HISTORIC CHURCHYARDS

05/91

The Chairman gave an update on this group, which were now a 'stand alone' body, and when they had their own funds there was the opportunity to attract matched funding from grant areas.

They hoped to shortly purchase equipment to test the safety of headstones in the various burial grounds and each 'parent' Parish Council could anticipate contributing around £500.

Eventually the aim was to have a website to enable the tracing of those buried in the graveyards.

PLAYING FIELD.

05/92

1. The replacement gates had still not been fixed and the Clerk was asked to obtain a quote to enable the Council to assess the likely costs of carrying out the work commercially.
2. Cllr Lanyon would speak to the electrician regarding the replacement of a floodlight bulb.
3. Cllr Langley had resigned as a Parish Council representative on the GPPA and Cllr Ivey agreed to replace her.
4. The Chairman talked to a leaflet he had recently shared at a meeting of the GPPA, highlighting areas that needed progressing in 2006. It was hoped that a meeting to further discuss the points, and any others that might be raised, would take place in January.

MOUNT WELLINGTON.

05/93

District Cllr Whiteley had asked the Parish Council to review its position on the Mount Wellington site, where nothing was happening following the removal (before possible listing) of the headgear.

After much discussion on a circulated report, the sites safety and planning status it was decided to 'sit on it' for the time being.

FOOTPATHS.

05/94

1. The Clerk read a letter and enclosures from a resident regarding byway 55 at Little Beside. Flooding / water pooling was so bad that the byway was impassable to walkers. District Cllr Whiteley asked for copies of the correspondence and would pass them on to County Cllr Hichens for action. There were comparisons to the Goongumpas Lane situation, where the Parish Council could not carry out work to the lane's surface, it being the responsibility of the County Surveyor.
2. Cllr Lanyon also mentioned similar pooling on byway 53, where a drain that ran under the Crofthandy – Triplet road needed to be cleared by County to take the water away.
3. Some of the flailing carried out at Goongumpas had missed lower vegetation - Paul Chegwidden would be asked to complete the work by hand.
